
PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE





Head Lice/Pediculosis

The York Catholic District School Board recognizes concerns related to pediculosis (head lice) at the school and community level. Pediculosis (head lice) are not a public hazard, as they do not cause illness, but they are a nuisance. To prevent pediculosis (head lice) from becoming a problem at our school we all need to work together. Please check your child's head on a regular basis for lice or nits. If you do find lice or nits, you must contact the office so that we can notify other parents in your child's class to keep a special watch for any signs of head lice. A student's readmission to school is contingent upon the Parent/Guardian submitting a completed and signed "Pediculosis Treatment Form" communicating to the Principal that treatment for pediculosis (head lice) can be found from Toronto Public Health www.toronto.ca/health and the Canadian Pediatric Society at https://www.caringforkids.cps.ca/handouts/head lice. A hard copy of the information may be provided by the Principal if requested by the Parent/Guardian.

Student Pick Up during School Day

We understand that situations arise where students need to be picked up during the school day. Please keep in mind that during recesses and at the end of the day, it may be more difficult for pick up. Please write a note to your child's teacher indicating the date and time that you will be picking them up so that the teacher can send them to the office in time for pick up. Recess hours are **10:10-10:25 am, 12:05-12:45pm and 2:05-2:20pm.** Students are outdoors and cannot be called in to be picked up. Please also be mindful that it is quite busy at the end of the day and so pick up after 3:00pm can be disruptive. If you can schedule pick up around these times, it would be greatly appreciated.
